# KINGS OF SADIE G. MAYS HONORED

His book, I Found My Way Home: Washed From a Life of Crime, was published in 2006. "I wrote the experiences that I've had in life. Some of it wasn't good. It was the truth," he said. He continued, "God redeemed me from all that. It's a Christian book talking of the redeeming power of God. Collins' wife helped him with the book. "We went to work. She was typing and I was writing. We finished in 2 weeks!" he said. Mr. Collins reported that they had several book signings in the city which were well attended, including one at StoneCrest Mall. Mr. Collins said that being at Sadie G. Mays was a blessing to them. "We couldn't help ourselves or each other. We went to praying and God led us here," he said.

Six gentlemen of Sadie G. Mays were honored on Friday, Oct. 27, 2017. The program was hosted by Mrs. Emily Wise and the Dixie Hills First Baptist Church of NW Atlanta. This was their 19th year, and possibly the final year, that they're hosting these special programs at SGM. Since 1999, the group has presented the "96 & Above" program honoring the facility's oldest residents. Those "eldest of the elders" are usually women. This was their first time hosting "The Kings of Sadie G. Mays" program. Mrs. Wise, the founder of the program, said they

### MAYS STATUE UNVEILED AT BIRTH HOME & MUSEUM

A new statue of Dr.
Benjamin E. Mays was
unveiled and dedicated at
the GLEAMNS Dr.
Benjamin E. Mays
Historical Preservation Site
in Greenwood, SC on Nov.
4, 2017. Sadie G. Mays
was represented by SGM
Board member, Marshalyn
Yeargin-Allsopp, MD, and
SGM Director of

Dr. Yeargin-Allsopp is the great-niece of Dr. Mays.
The program featured speeches by dignitaries from local and state government, Directors of the museum -- Loy Sartin and Rev. Christopher
Thomas; Dean Lawrence Carter of Morehouse
College; the keynote speaker, Rev. Dr. Otis Moss
Jr.; and Dr. Yeargin-Allsopp. Rev. Otis Moss said of Dr. Mays, "He was a Prophet of Freedom, an
Apostle of Excellence and a Disciple of Truth." Dr.
Yeargin-Allsopp said that Dr. Mays would "be so proud of how Greenwood County has embraced him." Indeed, this statue is the first and only statue

lauding any Greenwood County native. Benjamin Elijah Mays was born in 1894 near Epworth, South Carolina, to parents who were tenant farmers and former slaves. He is remembered for his outstanding leadership and service as a teacher, preacher, mentor, scholar, author and activist in the civil rights movement. He was perhaps best known as the longtime president of Morehouse

College in Atlanta, where he served from 1940 - 1967. He was an inspiration for one of Morehouse' College's most distinguished graduates, Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. '48, who called Dr. Mays his "spiritual mentor" and

"intellectual father." Later, as the Atlanta School Board's first black chair, Dr. Mays oversaw the desegregation of the Atlanta public schools between 1970 and 1981. He was married to Sadie Gray Mays for 43 years. She was a social worker, teacher and founder of the Happy Haven Nursing Home which later became the Sadie G. Mays Health & Rehabilitation Center. Dr. Mays died in 1984 and is buried on the grounds of the Morehouse campus alongside his beloved wife, Sadie. For more information see www.gleamns.org.
